Sternberg (1915-2005,) she came with him to Denver. Barbara was awarded a Teaching Assistantship to complete her Master's degree in Urban Sociology at DU. While raising five children, she taught courses in urban sociology and race relations at the University of Denver and Colorado Woman's College. She was devoted to: the improvement of mental health services, advancement of civil rights and educational innovation. She wrote non-fiction articles and collaborated with her husband on articles and books about urban planning and architecture. Their final book was about Evergreen, their adopted hometown. Barbara Sternberg says that writing about Anne Evans was a deeply satisfying excursion into the history of Colorado and of Denver, especially the rich tapestry of its cultural development. Unexpected discoveries about Anne Evans came to light during the research for this book.
